


Fig. 1-FORWARD CURRENT DERATING CURVE

Fig. 2-MAXIMUM NON-REPETITIVE PEAK FORWARD SURGE CURRENT




Fig. 3-TYPICAL REVERSE CHARACTERISTICS

Fig. 4-TYPICAL INSTANTANEOUS FORWARD CHARACTERISTICS




Fig. 5-TRANSIENT THERMAL IMPEDANCE




Fig. 6-TYPICAL JUNCTION CAPACITANCE
