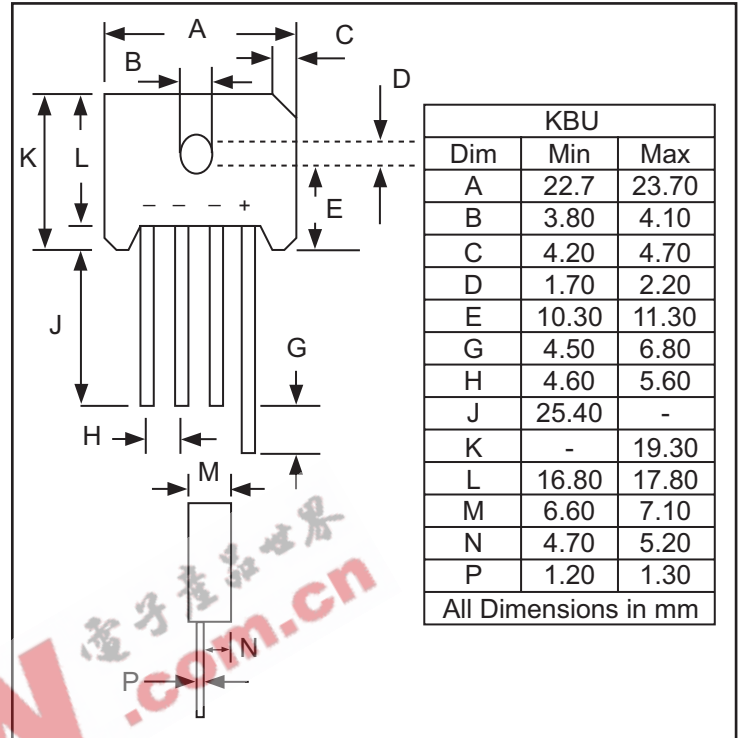

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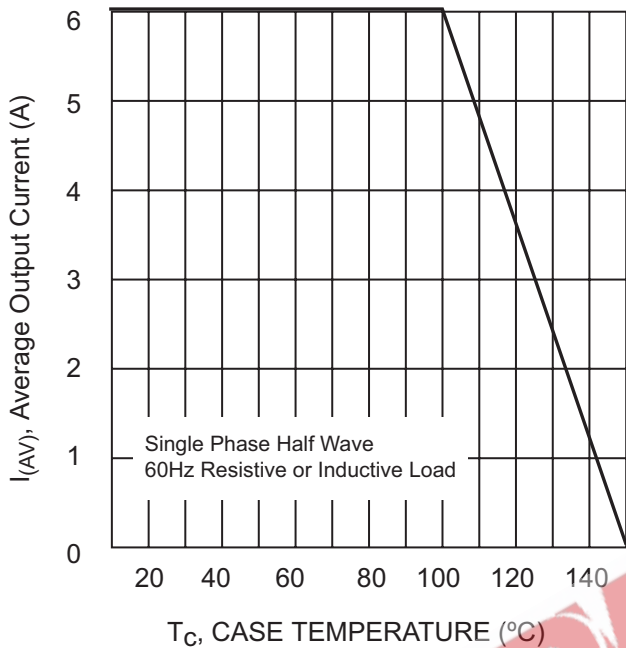


Fig. 1 Forward Current Derating Curve

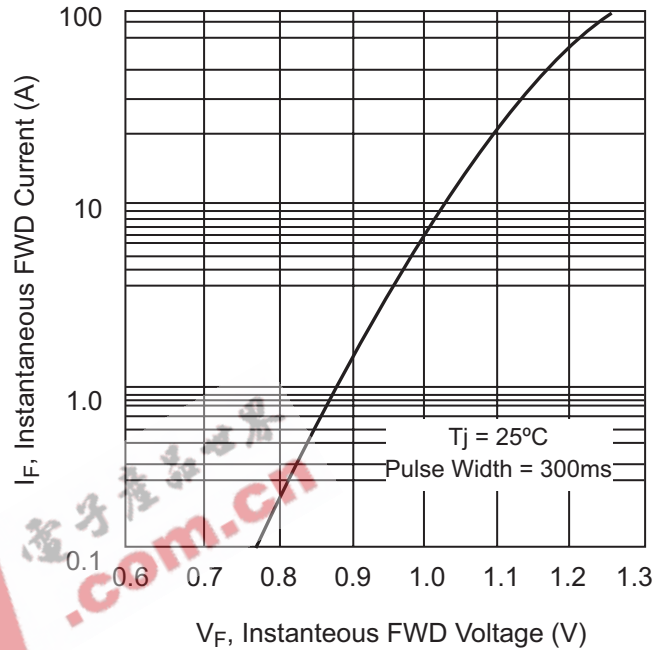


Fig. 2 Typical Forward Characteristics, per element

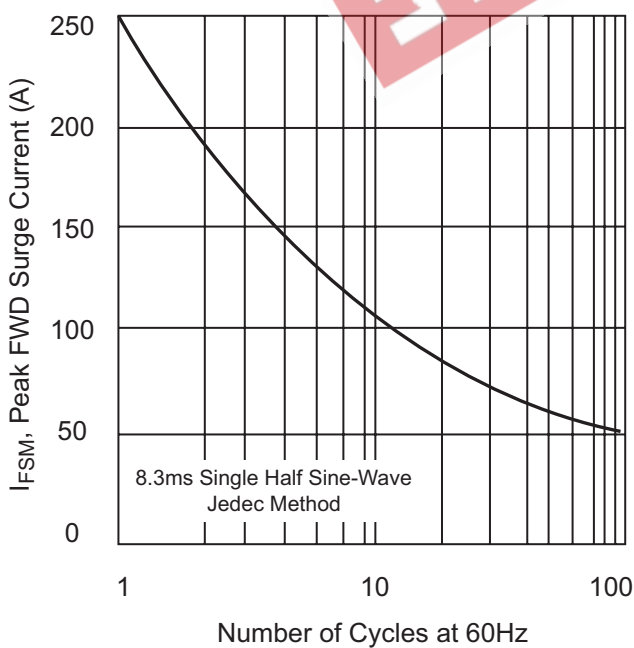


Fig. 3 Max Non-Repetitive FWD Surge Current

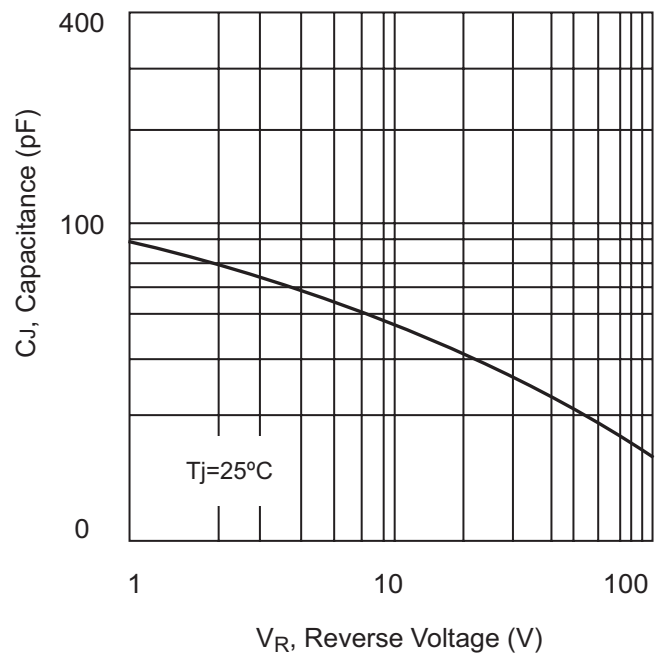


Fig. 4. Typical Junction Capacitance Per Element
