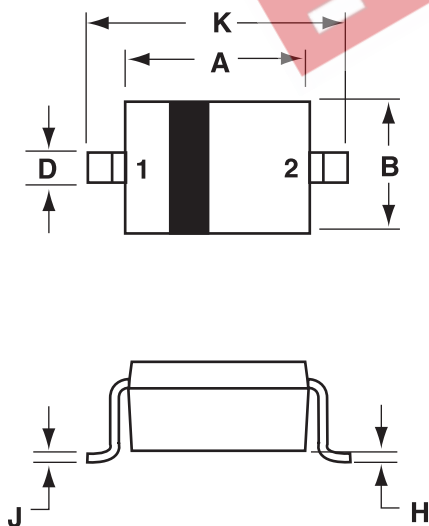

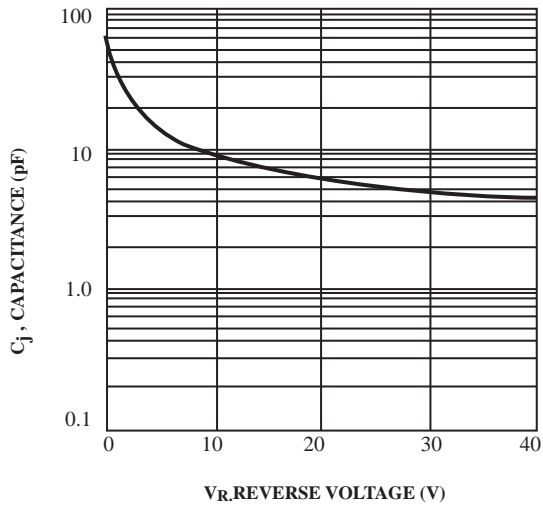


FIG. 2 Typ, Junction Capacitance vs. Reverse Voltage

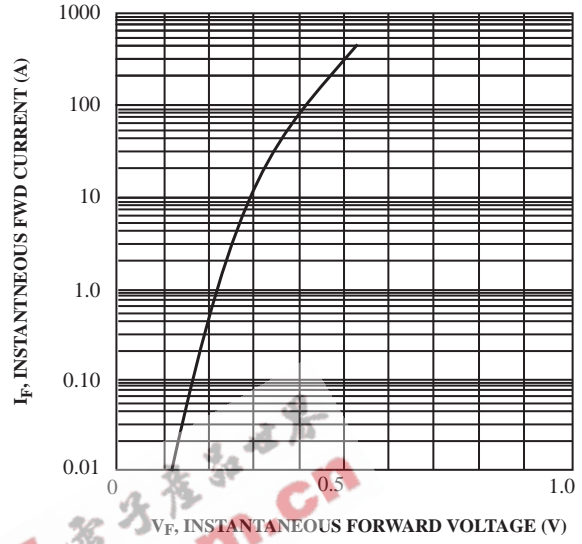


FIG. 2 Typical Forward Characteristics
